Carriage and Harness

Lovely, antique two-wheel Road Cart used with 14.2 h pony and 15.1 h horse Painted black with oak accents, leather-covered curved shafts.



Curved shafts are 78 inches in length, but 60 inches from the curve at the saddle to the singletree. The space between shafts is 39 inches at the singletree and 26 inches at the shoulder. 41 inch dished wheels that are 59 inches apart. Original, black bedford cord 23x14 seat as well as additional custom wedge 30x17 inches. The step is 20 inches from the ground.

Also available and shown with this turnout is imported English leather harness with brass on winkers, brow band and drops.

Whip'r Snapper Board Meeting

July 8, 2021 via conference call.

Online were Jennifer Russell; President, Elaine Boydston; Vice President, Diane Kern; Secretary, Jody Cutler, Katie Twohy, Marianne Bordier, Lori Weiss.

The April minutes were approved as published.

No treasurer's report at this time.

Membership Report:

Current membership number is 66, we have lost 22 members in the last year. Total income from membership is \$1,900. A discussion was held about the feasibility of raising the membership price to \$40 or even \$50. Some felt that covering the cost of our \$2,100 insurance by membership dues would be reasonable. Others felt that events (which usually make a profit) with the addition of sponsorship money would be enough income. It was decided to table the decision until the annual meeting or before the dues are payable in March.

New & Old Business:

Diane Kern suggested our club join the CAA (Carriage Association of America) as a chapter. No information was found on their website for the cost. We will try to find out how much it would be and discuss it at a future board meeting. An advantage to joining would be access to their video library. Some videos are free but others are free to members only. A movie night once a month was proposed if we could figure out how to get everybody on Zoom who was interested in watching at one time. If you have those skills call Diane Kern and we can discuss how it might work.

Katie Twohy will continue to send brochures to our new members. Additional brochures are in the show trailer. We will review the information they contain prior to a reprinting.

Marc DiLeo has suggested using the Apple Valley Horsemen's Center for an ADT or a pleasure show. Veronica Campbell and Marc are still trying to get together and go out to the location to review it's potential.

Lori Weiss reported that ETI Corral 101 has done a show or two at Earl Warren Showgrounds in Santa Barbara and they were well attended. First year fees to rent the facility are low and expected to increase next year.

The ETI (Equestrian Trails International) convention show this summer has been cancelled but is planned for July 2022.

Diane Kern will send out an email to the Whip'r Snapper group about Melanie Brooker's cancer prognosis. Her husband, Lee Worsham has posted on Facebook that her cancer has advanced and she is on home hospice. Melanie's friends are encouraged to drop her a line. The board agreed to send her flowers to her at home.

2021 Events:

September 17th-19th - There will be a Recreational Drive organized by our ADS regional representative Pam Miller in Tehachapi at the Bear Valley Springs facility. There are driving trails available and there will be games and a derby.

October 16th - Jody Cutler agreed to host a fall ADT at Oak Run Farm, Moorpark with assistance from the board to organize the event. The Oak Run facility is already set up for dressage and hazards, it just needs club support for the event. The tracks can be driven between hazards similar to the Sweetheart arrangement. That way the extra volunteers needed to staff horse trials would not be needed to hand out green cards and section timers.

The date proposed is October 16th, which is halfway between the two Clay Station events in October and a month after Sargent's CDE in September. We hope that will give everyone a rest between events. Jody Cutler will see if Hardy Zanke, from Rolling Hills Estates, CA can judge and do Sunday clinics. Our next option would be Jane Merritt from northern California. If there are fewer than 25 participants no technical delegate is required. It will be an ADS event.

We will offer training, preliminary, and intermediate divisions. Extra dressage tests or cones goes at a different level will be offered for an extra cost. We will do individual lunches, probably from Subway.
