



April 8th

This trip is turning out to be an adventure in weather. On my way to the McPhersons, I was lucky with the weather and only had occasional light rain. Around the Florida/Georgia border a huge black cloud with a long dark funnel was ahead of me to the east. I was happy to be following.



The McPhersons had a nice place to park with water and electricity and a huge grass paddock for Bow. They have a beautiful property that backs up to the Woods. Woods here are pine trees and ferns with nice footing and miles of trails very suitable for carriages. Bow and I enjoyed a tour with Ronda and her horse Alex. Bill Allen set me up to take an Obstacle lesson with Taylor Bradish on Saturday at the old Katydid. Saw Mickie Bowen. Sunday Bill and Kim invited me over for dinner. Bill and John are both good cooks. Ronda and I had lessons at her place on Monday. Ronda has 2 Obstacles up and cones at her place, and I used her grass dressage field with Jean Paul. She's so lucky no gophers! John never stops working on the place. Tuesday, we had rain. Wednesday, I packed ahead of the forecasted storm. After lunch we started hearing thunder and seeing lightning but little rain. From around 5pm to 6 am there was heavy thunder, lightning and pouring rain. I'm appreciating that the living quarters of the trailer are well insulated.

Enjoyed the drive up to Southern Pines and the change in scenery. Driving here I'm dependent on the directions of my phone. Most roads are one lane and roads sign are difficult to see and may have different names than the map. How do you know if you're going north, south, east or west when all you can see is a tunnel of trees and the sky overhead? Rango is being fairly good.

We arrived at the Carolina Horse Park around 1 just after the Allen's. I was able to unpack, organize and get Bow settled. I put the harness together which I had taken apart and cleaned last November.

Hitched Bow to see if all fit and drove for a few minutes before the 5:00 meeting. Walked the dressage court after and got a pretty good night's sleep. Up early to get Bow ready for our dressage time was 9:11. I was fairly happy with our test. <G> We won since I am the only one in my class CT. Weather wise Ronda and I were both lucky. The rain started as I was almost back to the barn after my dressage and the rain stopped about 15 minutes before Ronda's utility turnout class.
